## How to Apply for a Grant

The Nebraska Department of Justice uses the following considerations, among others, in its review of grant proposals and offers this information in an effort to be as open as possible about the grant application process.

Please be aware that the considerations listed below do not constitute a complete list. We do not use them as a checklist or a score card and meeting all of the considerations will not necessarily result in a grant award.

## Program Purpose

The environment is a treasured asset to the State of Nebraska. Nebraskans are proud of the blue sky visible from all corners of the state, scenic rivers that meander through the land, prairies that settlers flocked to so long ago, and cities that respect their surroundings.

For these reasons, the Attorney General's SEP Program looks to fund projects, activities and organizations that seek to invest in the environment. Please be advised that grants from the SEP Program are contingent on the availability of the environmental settlement funds.
