To provide Nebraska's youth an experience of state government and law, the Attorney General's Office is hosting the <u>Attorney General's Youth Conference at the Nebraska State Capitol on Tuesday</u>, April 10, 2018 from 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

This year, an appointed number of high school juniors from across the state will be selected to attend. Conference attendees will participate in discussion and debate of current issues, hear from AGO Bureau Chiefs, expand their understanding of the legal process in Nebraska, and eat lunch at the Governor's Residence.
